CANDLEWICK PRESS • TEACHER TIPS

- 13 Locate Haiti on a globe or map and read the author's note at the back of the book to learn more about the Haitian Revolution. Ask students whu they think it's so important for Ti Gran to share the history of Freedom Soup with her granddaughter.
- Belle calls her grandmother. Ask students to discuss the different names they use for their own grandparents or other relatives. What are the origins of those names?

S Discuss your students' New Year's Day or other traditions. Have them bring in a recipe for one of their family's traditional meals and write an explanation of its history and importance.
